#### 14)

We consider that now and for an extremely long period of time, if not forever, nation states will have and will have to play a key role both in Europe and in the world. Of course, the states of Europe will cooperate, take joint action in compliance with the EU Treaties, give up certain components of sovereignty, especially in the field of defense, but their role must be maintained and, in some areas, even strengthened.

We understand the participation of European states in the EU as equal partners and we reject, outright, any attempt by other states to subordinate in any way other states.

SUMMARY PASSAGE 7

#### 19)

Peoples and citizens must not be the kind of lambs that can be slaughtered at the will of someone outside. That is why the EU Treaties will have to be revised and based on democratic principles of management and decision-making with an emphasis on participatory democracy. This is as soon as possible, based on the experience gained and until centripetal movements to abandon European construction begin to develop.

#### **SUMMARY PASSAGE 8**

#### 21)

Any abuse in this regard must be sanctioned. 28) Our nation, the Romanian nation, in accordance with the provisions of the Treaties to which it is a party, must build its own future on its own, based on its aspirations, in full respect of the historical and religious traditions and cultural heritage it has and of which she is proud. The fundamental directions and options for building this future represent the exclusive prerogative of the Romanian nation and are manifested in referendums that can be initiated, in accordance with the law by citizens or by state institutions.
